Register Now for the NH Medicaid Quarterly Stakeholder Input Meetings

New Hampshire Medicaid is directly seeking your input on the future of the Medicaid to Schools (MTS) Program. To maintain a compliant claiming methodology with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the MTS program must transition from the in-kind model to a Certified Public Expenditure (CPE) financing methodology, supported by Random Moment Time Studies (RMTS) by June 2026.

To support this transition, New Hampshire Medicaid is looking to gather valuable stakeholder feedback on current and future program needs. Your perspectives will play an important role in understanding how to best support LEAs with the transition.

To obtain this feedback, the UNH Institute for Health Policy and Practice, in collaboration with JSI and the Department of Medicaid Services, will be hosting quarterly, virtual stakeholder input sessions for MTS stakeholders to attend:
